Here is something interesting I learned when I testified recently at the International Chamber of Commerce in Paris, on damages in a Euro 25 million case.

International Arbitration makes sense because you can collect.

International Arbitration can be better than court litigation because an International Arbitration Award is enforceable in most countries in the world. In court litigation the judgment can generally only be used to collect against assets in the country where the judgment is rendered.

For example, if you as a Canadian company go to court in Country A, and win a judgment against ABC Company, then you can only collect against assets of ABC Company in Country A. Alternatively, under an International Arbitration, if you win a judgment against ABC Company, you can collect against the assets of ABC Company in almost any country in the world.

The mechanism is the Convention on the Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Arbitral Awards, also known as the New York Convention. A list of selected countries where you can collect an International Arbitration Award is presented on the reverse.
